To be eligible for the IMEG Scholarship for 2023, a student must meet the following criteria:

- US Citizen
- Financial need
- Pursuing a degree in STEM-related field
- Full-time student, sophomore through senior, enrolled in Fall of 2023
- Not currently employed at IMEG or related to an IMEG employee
